Keeping our children safe online Information and guidance from E-Safety expert, Alan Mackenzie

An app notification was sent to parents and carers on Tuesday, containing information and a link to a short video regarding e-safety at home.

We have been talking to children about their online habits at home and have been shocked to hear that some children take their devices to bed with them, access the internet when their parents are asleep and know how to remove parental control settings. It's vitally important that we protect our children from online harm. The video link is one of six that we shall be sharing with you over the coming weeks - they are well worth watching!

We were really proud of some of our Year Six children this week who reported to their parents, Mr Moore and Mrs Channing that a man had started to follow their Tik Tok accounts and post inappropriate images. Mrs Channing referred this matter to the police and told the children that she was very proud that they had the courage and sense to report what they knew was an online danger. Well done, children!
