The deadline to apply for a secondary school place for September 2023 is 31st October 2022. If you have not applied for a place for your Y6 child, please submit their application as soon as possible.

Please don't assume that if you live in a school's catchment area your child will be allocated a place without you applying for one - this is not the case!

Parents of pupils living within North Yorkshire must apply online at:

www.northyorks.gov.uk/admissions

Parents of pupils living outside North Yorkshire must apply to their home authority and obtain information from them regarding their application process. If you want your child to attend a North Yorkshire school you still need to make the application to your home authority and information will be shared between Local Authorities as part of the Local Authorities' co-ordinated admissions scheme.
