We are proud to state that our school is part of Operation Encompass. This a national police and education early intervention safeguarding partnership, in place in every police force in England and Wales, which supports children and young people who experience Domestic Violence and Abuse. It enables the police to share information about police attended Domestic Abuse incidents which involve any of our children prior to the start of the next school day. Mrs Channing (our Key Adult and Designated Safeguarding Lead) has completed online Operation Encompass Key Adult training and will cascade the principles of Operation Encompass to all other school staff and Governors. Operation Encompass is a great way of professionals working together to safeguard and support our children.
