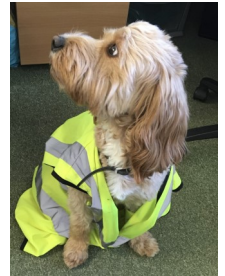
Well done to everyone who worked their socks off this week, producing some amazing work! It's always a pleasure to see your books, folks! Mrs Channing

What has Toby seen this week?

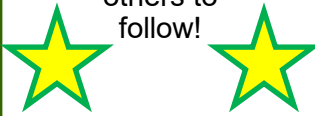
