

#### Managing behaviour - dispelling myths!

We are really proud of the positive behaviour we see in classrooms and on the playground each day. However, from time to time, children's behaviour may fall below our expected standards. When this happens, we try to understand the reason for the unacceptable behaviour, offer support, involve parents and issue sanctions in line with our Managing Behaviour Policy. Sometimes, reasonable adjustments are made in response to behaviour that may be linked to a child's disability or complex needs. This process is thorough, but not done publicly and so although children may have witnessed unacceptable behaviour, they don't see how it has been addressed.

There is a myth that children who misbehave are allowed to go and have fun with our Family Mentor, Lesley. This is a myth! They may go to her to practise their calming down strategies, analyse their behaviour, or discuss what has happened to enable Lesley to gather information that will be shared with key staff.
