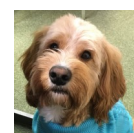
Pupils of the week

Mindfulness Matters

As you know, we believe that emotional health is just as important as physical health. We recognise that children and adults alike need time for quiet reflection from time to time. Yoga and meditation are written into our PE curriculum to ensure that we give our children the skills to be able to self regulate and practise mindfulness.

I am delighted to announce that, after the holiday, Mrs Sellers will be running a Mindfulness Club in her classroom every Wednesday from 12-12.30. Children of any age are welcome and will be able to have quiet time, listening to gentle music and completing mindfulness activities. Children don't have to commit to attending the club every week - they may just pop in when they feel the need for peace and reflection.
