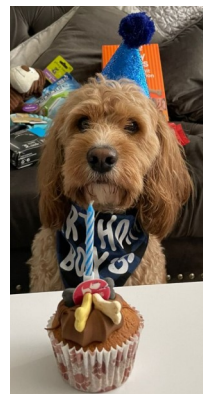

A polite request...

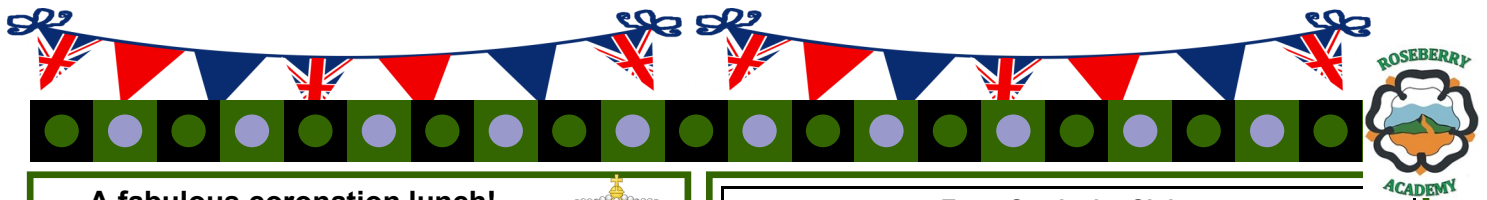
