All pupils across the school engage in regular physical activity, both during PE lessons and during daily break and lunch times	<p>Employment of qualified sports teacher to review the new, whole school, PE curriculum plan (including the National Awards Programme with children working towards national awards in athletics and gymnastics), ensuring children take part in regular high quality physical activity. Sports teacher to work with staff to consider how the 'Daily Mile' may be implemented across the school.</p> <p>The whole school curriculum plan will clearly outline skills progression throughout the school in order to raise standards in the delivery and assessment of PE across the school by key staff, who will benefit from training and ongoing guidance and support delivered by the qualified sports teacher.
