



Roseberry Academy **School Sports Premium- Plan 2018-19**

Vision: All children leave our academy physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. All children leave being able to swim 25m unaided and have the skills to self save.

NB In 2017/18 83% of Year Six children were able to swim 25m unaided.

Objective: To achieve self sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in our academy against 4 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity- promoting healthy active lifestyles
2. Closing the gender gap between children accessing a range of after school sporting provision
3. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
4. Continued increase in participation in competitive sport

Total Funding allocated: £17,910

This plan is reviewed termly in conjunction with the Principal and Tom Burke Academy key personnel.
