How do we teach writing at Roseberry?

- Taught through the Power of Reading, where children are immersed in high quality texts.
- Texts match the current topics which makes learning more relevant and enables children to make links across the curriculum.
- Consistency throughout school. All classrooms display learning walls which share current texts and model expectations and quality of work across writing and grammar.
- Within writing, children are given specific targets (steps to success) tailored towards their individual needs and allowing for continuous progression.





ERIC

- Everyone Reads In Class during this session, children are encouraged to listen to books read to them or books which they read themselves.
- Children may read to another child (Y6 readers) or to the teacher.
- Reading books are changed at least 3 times a week and children are encouraged to change the books themselves.
- ERIC is an ideal opportunity for children to deepen their love for reading!
- Embed VIPERS through discussion and exploration of the high quality texts.

How do we teach reading at Roseberry?

- Reading is taught using the 6 main domains of the National Curriculum, which we feel are the key areas children need to know and understand to improve their comprehension of texts.
- VIPERS is an acronym used to recall the main domains (Vocabulary, Infer, Predict, Explain, Retrieve and Sequence)
- ▶ VIPERS is not a scheme but a method which all classes adopt consistently across school to ensure that teachers ask, and children become familiar with, a range of questions.
- Children should read widely once they have graduated from the RWI programme. The scheme may still be used for children who require additional phonic support.

Retrieve

Identify and explain the key features of fiction and non-fiction texts.

Sequence

Sequence the key events in the story.



No Nonsense spelling

- No Nonsense Spelling is a complete spelling programme designed to meet the needs of the 2014 National Curriculum in a manageable way.
- Learning new ways of spelling phonemes for which one or more spellings area already known, and learning some words with each spelling, including a few common homophones.
- Children learn spellings using a range of different strategies (speed write, rainbow write, dictation, pyramid words)
- Learn to spell common exception words
- Words set weekly

Why Read Write Inc Phonics?



- Read Write Inc. Phonics teaches children to read accurately and fluently with good comprehension.
- They learn to form each letter, spell correctly, and compose their ideas step-by-step.
- After graduating from RWI, all children will continue to use their phonic knowledge to decode and blend more advanced vocabulary as they begin to read more widely.
- Some children may continue to receive small guided phonics sessions to master phonics and to prepare them for the phonics screening in summer 2023.

Reading Eggs

- Reading Eggs is a superb ICT resource that has been purchased for all children to use.
 Every child has their own username and password
- Encourages reading and is motivationalgames and activities (winning eggs to 'buy' things for an avatar)
- Children find it exciting
- Tracks the children at their own pace. Tasks are regularly set by the teacher.

What can you do at home?

- Read at home with your child. Listen to them and share books together.
- Reading little and often at least 3 times a week.
- Comprehension questions discuss themes in the book and what happened. Use
 VIPERS to develop key skills
- Reading Eggs
- ► Test spellings read it, say it, write it, check it and using strategies like rainbow write, speed write
