


JEWELLERY:

Labels, labels everywhere!



Please take advantage of having your child's initials embroidered onto their uniforms as it makes finding and returning lost property a lot easier!

PLEASE – Label every item of clothing that your child wears at school, as well as bags, water bottles and any spare clothing so that any lost items can be found and returned easily. It is important to label your child's shoes as your child will take their shoes off and wear wellies in our wildlife area. A lot of shoes can be either the same design or size therefore matching up pairs can be tricky!

Children may access either playground and, in good weather, the field. There is a climbing wall, two beautiful wildlife areas and an art therapy base which is accessible with adult supervision.



We have not one, but two beautiful wildlife areas!

The upper area has a bird hide and feeding station, bug hotels, information boards and a covered seating area!



It even has a fire pit where we can toast marshmallows and sing songs!

Our environment

Children who are new to the school soon become confident to move between buildings and the fencing keeps them separate from any vehicles on site. The gate at the bottom of the hill is operated with a security code to ensure children's safety. This is locked at morning registration by a senior member of staff.

Your children will be taught in the upper school building, which also houses the lunch hall and library. They will also access the lower school building in order to use the lower hall for PE, assemblies and productions.

The school day

Mrs Channing will be on the gate at 8.35am and all children, whichever year group they are in, will be able to arrive at 8.35am and go straight to their classroom. Registration will be 8.45am for the whole school.

At 3:10 pm, children will be let out of school via Y3/4 entrance on the top playground, to be collected at the gate.

A typical day is: Register/handwriting skills, literacy, reading comprehension, morning break, numeracy, lunch, ERIC, topic, assembly, spellings, home time

We also operate a Breakfast Club from 7.30am every day and there is a privately run after school club on site from 3pm – 6pm (charges apply).



School dinners at Roseberry Academy are delicious and nutritious. Your child will have a choice of a hot or cold meal and access to the salad bar.

Don't forget to download the My child at school app so that you can book your child's meal in advance.



TEAMS

The communication platform we use is Microsoft Teams and each class has their own page. Every child will have their own log in details, ensuring the platform is secure and for school use only.

This is where we will share with you information of our topics and associated key knowledge that will be learned. We will also post photographs of children's learning and the fun they have in school.

The Teams page works in a similar way to Facebook. When the Teams page is unmuted, you will be able to add comments to the photographs we post and also share photographs of activities or new skills that your child has learned at home.

It is important to check the class Teams page regularly as we also use this to share important information and inform you of future events.

Communication via My Child At School

It's *really* important that you register and log into your My Child At School account and set up notifications on your device. This, along with our weekly newsletter and class Teams page, is our method of communication with you (unless in the case of an emergency).

Roseberry Academy's Curriculum for All 2023-24

Our curriculum cultivates a love of learning, inspires curious minds, and constructs the foundations upon which children's future knowledge may be built.

Our curriculum design is based upon evidence from cognitive science and three main principles underpin it:

1. Learning is most effective with spaced repetition.

2. Interleaving helps pupils to create links between topics and concepts and aids long-term retention.

3. Retrieval of previously learned content is frequent and regular which increases both storage and retrieval strength.

Our curriculum is broad and balanced and teachers work hard to ensure that lessons are exciting and engaging. As well as learning and remembering key knowledge, we feel it is important for children to experience a range of high quality experiences and so have created an enrichment curriculum to enhance this. We refer to this as our 'Dinner Party' curriculum. There are four stages as we work through when children access a new unit of topic based learning. These are as follows:

1.**Engage** - The first stage is to engage the children and gain children's curiosities. We do this in different ways e.g. inviting presenters /experts to school , engaging in practical activities, visiting local attractions.

2. **Develop** –Next, the children explore themes, concepts and subjects in greater depth.

3.**Innovate** - Children are then offered a range of stimulating scenarios. Here, we encourage children to think creatively, using the knowledge they have gained from previous lessons.

4.**Express** - Finally, the children reflect on their learning. They are given the opportunity to explain their learning in different ways.

Celebrating Cultures Week


At the end of Autumn 1 term, Spring 1 term and Summer 1 term the whole school celebrates different cultures from around the world. Why do it? Children learn a range of skills and experience a wide variety of enrichment opportunities.

Reading

We teach reading and writing discretely and



through an integrated approach, using Text Interrogation (being a text detective) and CLPE (Centre for Literacy in Primary Education).

Our teaching approach enables us to assess children's reading abilities without hearing them read one to one. However, this may be the case with children who find reading to be a challenge or are still accessing scheme books.

For the majority of children, the emphasis on reading turns from decoding the text, to the understanding of it. It is expected that children will practise their reading skills at home and these will be assessed in school.

Reading

Children will choose books from our varied reading scheme until we deem that they are able to become 'free readers'; choosing books from the school/library/home.

Books vary in length therefore our expectation is that as soon as a child has finished the book, another may be chosen. Children are given the independence to do this on their own.

They are encouraged to read a range of texts, including those in Reading Eggspress and the First News publication we purchase for them – not just their reading book.

Children are rewarded for their reading by receiving a certificate for every 20 books read.

Please ensure that you have signed the home/school booklet each time you have heard your child read, not just when your child has finished a book!



Music

We offer all children opportunities to develop their musical talent and understanding through the delivery of the National Curriculum and performances throughout the year and, in response to recent proposals from the DfE (June 2022), will be focusing upon enhancing musical experiences next year as part of our ongoing curriculum development.

We offer a base for external providers to enable children to access private lessons in school and the Local Authority Music Service currently visits to offer guitar and piano tuition.*

What else have we got to offer?

School Production

Each year the Year 3 and 4 children put on a production for the school and their families. It is a chance for all to shine!







Homework

- Each week children will receive:
- 10 spellings
- **One piece of Mathletics**
- **Reading Eggspress assignments**
- 10 mins reading four times per week
- (adult to sign reading record, please!)

Topic Homework – The children are given topic homework to do at the beginning of each new topic. This helps with engagement and the children thoroughly enjoy sharing their creations with the class. This task is open ended and children may choose how to attempt it. For example, they may wish to bake, draw, create a PowerPoint presentation or make a model.



Positive attitudes

Throughout the week the children are rewarded for their efforts in learning and behaviour.

- Team Points Rewarded for positive behaviours and attitudes in the classroom.
- Pupil of the Week One person from each class is chosen each week for their achievements. This is presented in the celebration assembly on a Friday morning.
- Half term hero One person from each class is chosen each half term for showing exceptional attitudes towards their learning.
- Act of Kindness Given to pupils by any adult in school who has witnessed an act of kindness.
- Scores on the doors Each class is awarded a collective grade by their teacher
- Lunch time award
 Given by the midday supervisors for good behaviours during lunch times
- **Captains' choice-** Team captains award team points to children who demonstrate beautiful behaviour during assembly.
- Reading certificates Given to pupils for every 20 books they have read. (Larger books count as 2)
- Mrs Channing's smiley stickers

Celebrating Success!
