# COVID TESTS

The Government wants members of households, childcare or support bubbles of school staff to get tested twice a week using home test kits. At this stage, there is no requirement to get primary aged children tested but adults living and working with children are being encouraged to carry out regular Lateral Flow Tests in order to identify and isolate more quickly and therefore stopping the spread of the virus.

If your child is displaying symptoms of Coronavirus you must not send her/him to school. If your child develops symptoms while at school, she/he will be sent home to self-isolate and should arrange to have a test as soon as possible.

You can get a twice-weekly test:

- through your employer if they offer testing to employees
- at a local test site
- by collecting a home test kit from a test site
- by ordering a home test kit online

#### Please note that we are unable to give you the test kits.

Households are asked to:

- Take a test twice a week (we suggest every Sunday and Wednesday)
- Report every result to NHS Test and Trace on the same day you take the test
- Report your test result online or by calling 119.
- If anyone tests positive or gets coronavirus symptoms, they should tell the school and:
- ◊ self-isolate immediately
- o get a PCR test to confirm the result
- **o** follow the stay at home guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection

A negative result means the test did not find signs of coronavirus. But this does not guarantee you do not have coronavirus, so you should keep following all coronavirus advice including:

- regular handwashing
- social distancing
- wearing a face covering where recommended
