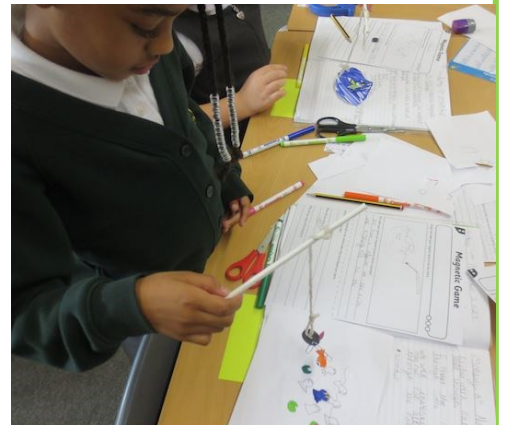
Mexico Class

This week in Science, the children in 3M were able to compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of which materials magnets could attract through. They completed their own investigation to find out which materials a magnet would attract a metal paper clip through.



The children learnt that magnets have a magnetic field around them that produces a pulling force on some materials. And this pulling force can go through materials such as wood and paper.

The children were then able to design and create a magnetic game or fridge magnet and explain how their games worked, how magnets were used and the pulling force.



At the end of the session the children assessed their peers' Magnetic Game by completing an evaluation sheet to comment on their game and how well it worked.

Remembrance Day



5J wanted to find out about Remembrance Day and why we have 2 minutes silence every year on the 11th November at 11am. There were many questions they wanted answers to, so we set about researching the historical context behind the wearing of poppies.

5J produced posters to show their understanding of the sacrifice of soldiers in the war and where the idea came from to use the poppy as a symbol of remembrance. 5J can also name the key people involved in the early history of the Remembrance Poppy.

The children in R1 have settled back in really well after the half term break. Our topic this term is 'Our Community' and we have started to look at all the different people who help us. With the support of some of our fabulous parents we have made our very own Rushey Green McDonald's. The children have enjoyed taking on the different roles, such as the person who takes the orders and the person who makes the happy meals.



During our forest school sessions the children have continued to enjoy exploring the area and the environment. Last week they made magic wands. First, they needed to find a large stick and then they had to add on their decorations. Joanna even created a three-coloured pattern on hers with beads. Once complete they then cast spells on each other and even their mums and dads!



During our daily maths sessions, the children have been learning to subitise (which means how many in a set by 'just seeing rather than counting'). They have also been looking at cardinality (Which means the number of items in a set). Their favourite lesson though was looking at how the number three can be represented in different ways.
