## Coronavirus update 20.03.2020

Dear All,

Most of you will now know that Wednesday, the government ordered schools in the UK to close on Friday afternoon until further notice.

I realise this is distressing news for the entire school community and will leave many anxious, but I want to reassure everyone that we have spent a great deal of time preparing for this announcement. I feel very confident we have everything in place to ensure that we continue to support you and your children in the coming weeks and months.

This summer's KS2 SATs, GCSE, A Level and other public exams will not go ahead. Our children have worked so hard preparing for their SATs and the uncertainty about what arrangements the government will put in place will no doubt cause a great deal of anxiety. The government says it will work with schools to ensure children get the qualifications that they need. As more details are released we will be doing everything we can to help children understand what it means for them.

Whilst we are operating a partial closure we want all of our families to know we are here to support where we can.
