
We all want to say a big well done to Year 6 for managing so well with their SATs last week!



Ravensbourne is one of the tributaries connecting to the River Thames in South London, England. It travels in the Tidal River Thames in Deptford.

How amazing! The River Ravensbourne is 11 miles long it runs from Keston to Deptford Creekside. According to Peter Ackroyd, the Ravensbourne was named by Julius Caesar, when he caught a Raven flying over a drinking well at a source of this river! Ravensbourne river travels through the Boroughs of Bromley, Lewisham and Greenwich, where it meets the River Thames at Creekside. The tide is said to be low, and reported to be very muddy.

Why not explore our local river this weekend? It's fully pedestrianised so you can take your bike, scooter or just walk and enjoy our local river.
