We have been doing some activities related to the topic, like making




superhero masks or bracelets.

last week we read the story "Super Daisy" which the children loved and they have done "super" writings about it.


During our forest school session, the children have continued to enjoy exploring the area and the environment.



They have been making different recycled instruments out of bottles and boxes.




The children have also been learning to double numbers until five ("double 1 is 2".2 is made from 1") using rekenreks to help them. They have been also learning about even and odd numbers.






This term in Science, Brazil Class has been immersed in learning about plants

They will be working hard on the finishing touches of their end of year play.




**Rights Respecting Schools**


