We have been doing some activities related to the topic, like making superhero masks or bracelets.

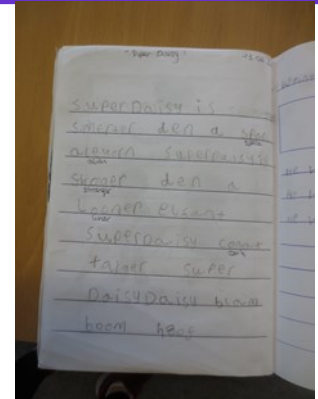
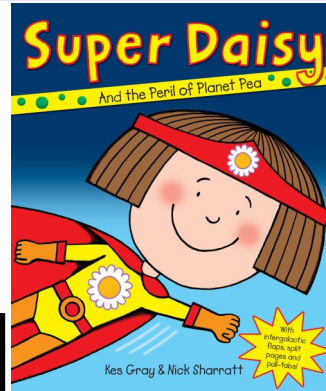


last week we read the story "Super Daisy" which the children loved and they have done "super" writings about it.

The children have also been learning to double numbers until five ("double 1 is 2". 2 is made from 1") using rekenreks to help them. They have been also learning about even and odd numbers.



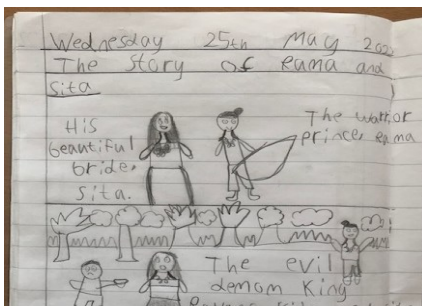
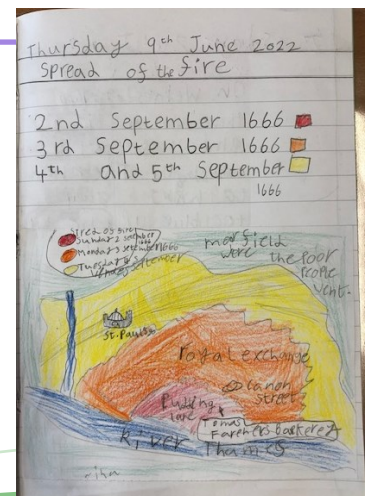
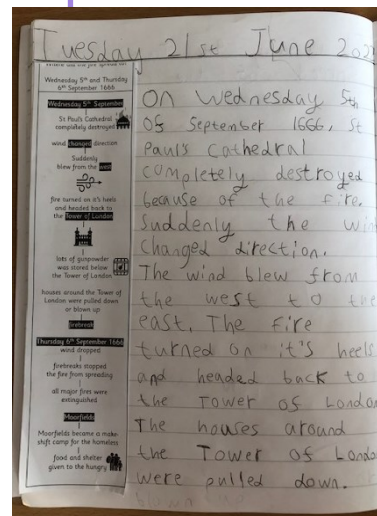
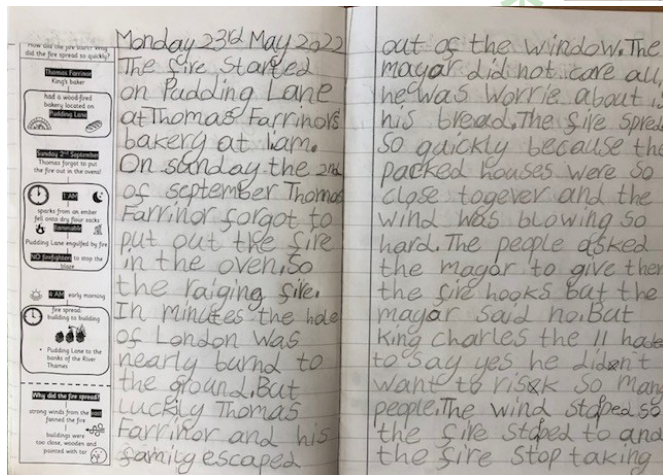
First of all, they had to go and find some natural resources to put in their bottles, like sticks or stones. And then, let the fun begin!

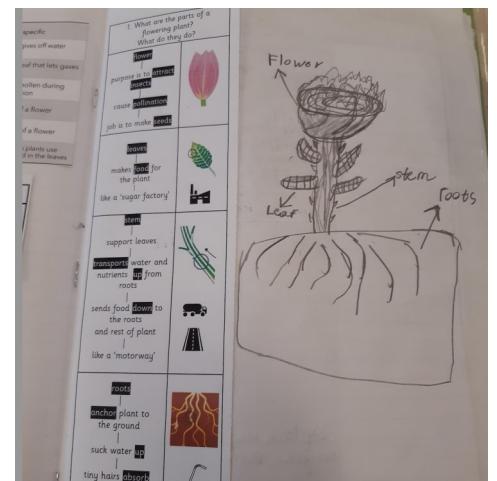
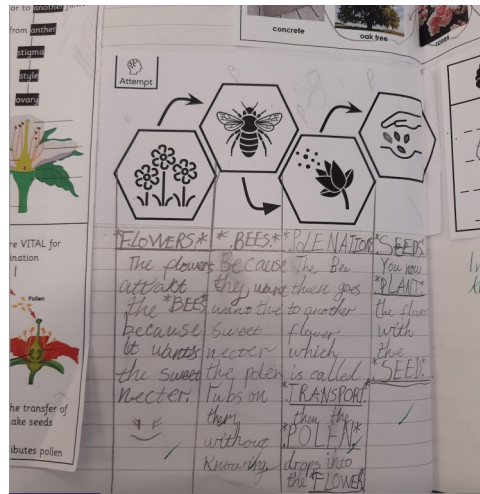
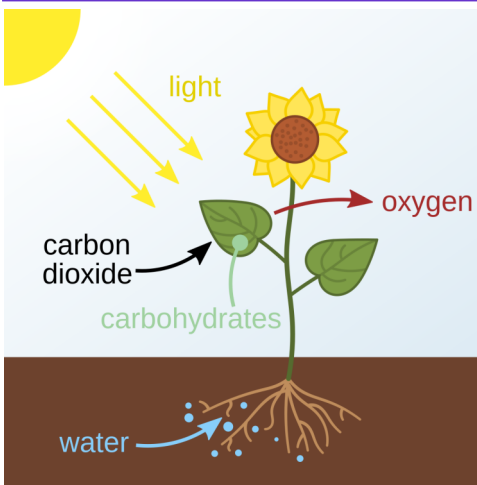


BRAZIL CLASS

They have developed technical language to name parts of a plant and describe the process of photosynthesis.

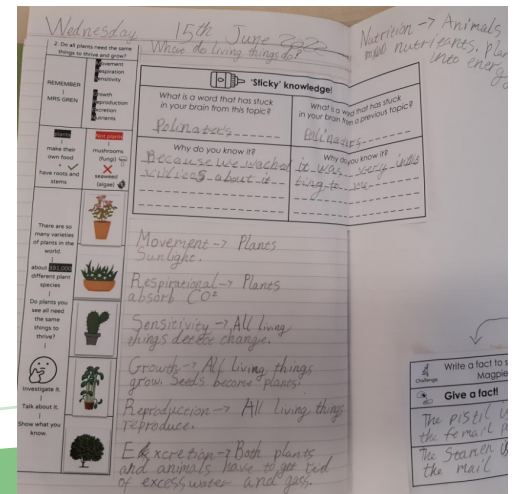
Students have displayed their knowledge through diagrams and flowcharts, and have drawn conclusions to investigations on pollination and transpiration.

YEAR 6

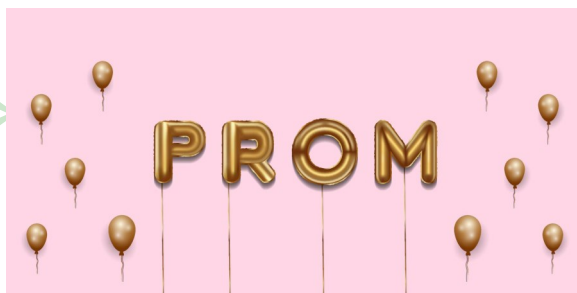
The last Summer half term will be a busy one for year 6's as they're getting ready for their next destinations....
