
### **Rights Respecting Schools**

Thank you to all our children and staff for their hard work and thank you to the community for your continued support.







# NIGERIA CLASS


We have loved learning about our topic of Minibeasts and Growing this half term.




In Maths, we have been learning about measuring. In Literacy we have been reading 'Oliver's Vegetables' by Vivian










# POLAND CLASS

In English, we have been improving our SPAG - spelling, punctuation and grammar.




