This term our topic is...

The Cold War

Evolution & Inheritance

This term our **History and Geography** topic is the Cold War. The children will be exploring the Cold War (1947-1991) and the tense relationship between USA and the Soviet Union. The children will learn about the leaders of the 'Super Powers,' as well as locating each country on a historical world map. We will learn about the factors leading to the 'Space Race' and how the Cold War was concluded and the impact it had on the rest of the world.

Science: We will be learning about Charles Darwin and the theory of evolution. The children will discover how different animals & species have evolved over time. The children will also look at inheritance and characteristics, features passed from parents as well as similarities between siblings.

Maths: We will consolidate Fractions, Decimals and Percentages, we will also be learning to use simple formula to express missing numbers algebraically including finding 2 unknown quantities using formula. We will compare ratios and explore different reprentations of ratios from given amounts. We will continue to find the area, perimeter and volume of compound shapes. The children should also continue to consolidate their understanding of the 12x tables, this can be completed using the PIXL Times Tables APP.

Writing: The chn will be creating their own poetry based on Dreadful Menace, they will be encouraged to use a range of figurative language including hyperboles, alliteration, personification, symbolism similes and metaphors. The children will also be reading The Other Side of Truth by Beverley Naidoo, in this powerful narrative the we follow the trials of Sade & Femi, forced to leave their home in Nigeria, the story addresses themes of immigration, human rights, political asylum, family, exile and freedom. The children will use this text as a stimulus for writing in all genres. The will also continue to apply the conventions of grammar, varying sentences and vocabulary can engage the reader.

Reading

Every morning the children in Year 6 take part in Reading session. Reading session to give children a deeper understanding of the texts, this term Year 6 will be focusing on Reading comprehension techniques and continue to develop and embed skills to support them to answer longer unseen reading texts.

The children will continue to use the principals of Destination Reader reading stems, and will continue to have the opportunity to orally rehearse the answers to questions posed with their partner. Each reading sessions has a focus in Year 6, we have been combining strategies.

The strategies are:

- Questioning
- Predicting
- Clarifying
- Evaluating
- Inferring
- Making connections
- Summarising

This is a whole class approach; however, some children will be taught in smaller groups.

In class children use the CLEAR strategies to answer questions, ask your child to show the actions for these!
