The children in Reception have settled back in really well after the Christmas holidays and have enjoyed listening to many different traditional stories. So far, they have learnt about Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs and this week they have been acting out the story of Little Red Riding Hood.

Last week the children made their own porridge and made a bar chart to show which porridge they liked best. The options were porridge with strawberry jam, honey or just plain. Looking at the bar chart we can see that honey was the most popular. During the literacy lesson the children each made a wanted poster for the big bad wolf. They used many adjectives to describe him, for example he has big sharp teeth, he has big ears and he has long hair. So, if you see him around the school, please let us know. Here are some of the children's work. Look at their amazing sentences with finger spaces and full stops.

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During our daily maths sessions, the children have been building on their understanding of the composition of numbers by investigating the composition of 3, 4 and 5. The children started to look at part-part-whole relations, for example seeing that 3 can be composed of 1 and 2. Below are some examples of the different ways 5 can be made. First, we used multilink to create the number 5, then we drew our blocks in as many different ways to represent 5.

In Science, we are studying Earth and Space. Jamaica Class have really enjoyed investigating each of the planets in our Solar System and the similarities and differences between them. The children in 5J decided to create our own planets and a fact file to go with them. We also learnt a rap to remind us about each phase of the moon. 5J thoroughly enjoyed singing the rap and were able to remember the scientific names of each phase.

Inspired by Music

British composer Gustav Holst, wrote a sevenmovement orchestral suite, called 'The Planets' between 1914-1916. The music represents all of the known planets, which were visible from Earth at the time, and their supposed astrological character. 5J listened to the music and created actions to go with each piece.

Saturn – The Bringer of Old Age. It starts off slow and quite unsettling, then develops into a heavy march.



Mars – The Bringer of War. Angry and omi nous, the movements represent the Roman God of War.

Venus – The Bringer of Peace. Played on harps, flutes and the violin, this piece is slower and much more relaxed.
