R1 Somalia class have been learning about pirates this half term

The children in R1 have been reading books about pirates this half term. They have enjoyed acting out these stories in the role play area and they have also made treasure maps, hooks, pirate hats and treasure chests. They even wrote their own story about '10 Little Pirates.'

On Wednesday the children were super excited to go on their first-ever class trip to Moon Lane Bookshop in Catford. We took the 185 bus and entertained the other passengers by singing 'Wheels on the bus' on our journey. Once at the bookshop, we went upstairs and had some pirate stories read to us. The children's behaviour was exemplary throughout and they were a credit to the school.



Finally, the children had their first-ever assembly with all their parents and carers. Jules and Tom were so proud of their achievements as they showcased their Makaton skills when singing the hello and goodbye songs. They also shared some facts about pirates and sang the songs I'm a Little pirate and 'The Big Ship Sails on the Alley Alley Oh'.

<u>1R</u>

It has been another great week in 1R, we've been learning whilst having fun! We planted some wildflowers in our flower bed outside the classroom and now we are hoping that they will start to grow soon.

In English we've been learning about story writing; stories with a familiar setting, writing the beginning, middle and end of a story. We read the story about The Three Little Pigs for inspiration and we all loved it! We wrote stories about a lonely tiger living in the school playground. We had to compose our sentences aloud before writing short narratives in our books. The sentences had to include conjunctions and adjectives to make the sentences a bit more interesting.



In maths we've started to measure and compare the weights of different objects. We've learnt new vocabulary such as: weight, mass, scales, light, heavy, lighter and heavier. We used scales to measure various items that could be found in the classroom and compared the weight of the objects to cubes. During the week we also learned about odd and even numbers and how to solve various mathematical problems.



The topic in PSHE this half term is Healthy Me and we have been learning about how to look after ourselves and how to stay healthy and happy. We have discussed the importance of: eating healthy food, sleeping, resting, exercising, drinking water, washing and being clean.



In Design and Technology we have been learning about structures. On Monday we learned about the importance of a strong sturdy foundation and balance. We used wooden blocks to build structures exploring various ways of building and what works best. On Tuesday we looked at various joining techniques and methods of joining pieces e.g. cardboard together. We really enjoyed learning about the different types of joining. On Wednesday we used empty and clean cereal boxes, cardboard boxes, yoghurt pots etc to build structures. We had to consider what we had done on Monday and Tuesday in order to build structures.







Brazil Class

Brazil Class are exploring Aboriginal Art and the art methods used by Indigenous Australians, including rock painting, dot painting, rock engravings, bark painting, carvings, sculptures, and weaving and string art. Their knowledge has extended to Aboriginal spirituality and their links to the land and spirit through the Dreamtime. Students developed an understanding that Indigenous Art is centred on storytelling and that the use of symbols is an alternate way to writing down stories of cultural significance.

3B students have demonstrated a true passion for visual arts and have been able to express themselves through symbolic painting. Students have used Aboriginal symbols to communicate their own story based on different totem animals of Indigenous Australians.



Nursery

There were lots of fun, exciting activities happening in the nursery for world book week. We spent the week looking at a class favorite, the Hungry caterpillar, and all worked together to try and make our classroom door look as fantastic as possible for the school competition!





Our children were very excited to dress up as their favourite characters on world book day. As you can imagine, we had lots of fantastic superheroes in the class (comic books are books too!) as well as some lovely princes and princesses. We all took a trip to the small hall and did a catwalk around the room to show off our fantastic outfits.







Poland class

Poland class has been busy, preparing for a week of story writing. On Monday, we took our learning outside to discover how many nouns we could find in the school playground. We used our senses to explore our surroundings and then used adjectives to describe the things we saw, felt and heard. All our ideas will be used to create a story all about a lonely tiger who finds his way into our playground.

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In Maths we have been looking at measurements. This week we have been learning about weight and using vocabulary like mass; weight; scales; heavier and lighter. We have had lots of practical experience and used our knowledge to help us solve problems.

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Reception World Book Day 2022

We have had an amazing World Book Day! The Reception team were so impressed with all of the children's outfits and we all had so much fun. Here are some of the things we got up to...



All 3 classes got together in the small hall for a catwalk! We cheered each other on and striked a pose for the camera. After everyone had had a turn (even the grown-ups!), we all had a dance party!



The grown-ups dressed up as pirates, as that is our topic this half term, and we have been reading lots of pirate stories with the children!





Year 2 had a fabulous time on World Book Day!

We began our day with a book based quiz as our morning work followed by assembly with Ms Maria where each class had a chance to parade their outfits.

This gave us all a chance to admire all of the book cover doors on our way to the hall. Year 2 had chosen books with a nature theme and each of the doors featured trees. It was great fun designing the doors at the beginning of the week-we made a lot of leaves!

There were lots of book related activities throughout the day, in fact Ms Maria told us during assembly that normal lessons were illegal on WBD!

We designed our own bookmarks, created new covers for our Year 2 prize book "Moth" by Isabel Thomas and wrote reviews of some of our favourite books.

Our teachers loved the opportunity to fit in lots of stories, particularly some books that we hadn't read before.

In the afternoon all the Year 2 classes sowed new seeds in the planters outside our rooms to tie to our nature theme. We're looking forward to the beautiful flowers already.

At the end of the day our teachers went to different classes to read them a story and we had guest teachers to read to all of us. A lovely end to a brilliant WBD!
