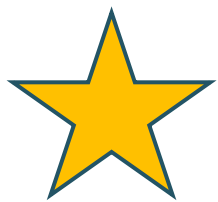

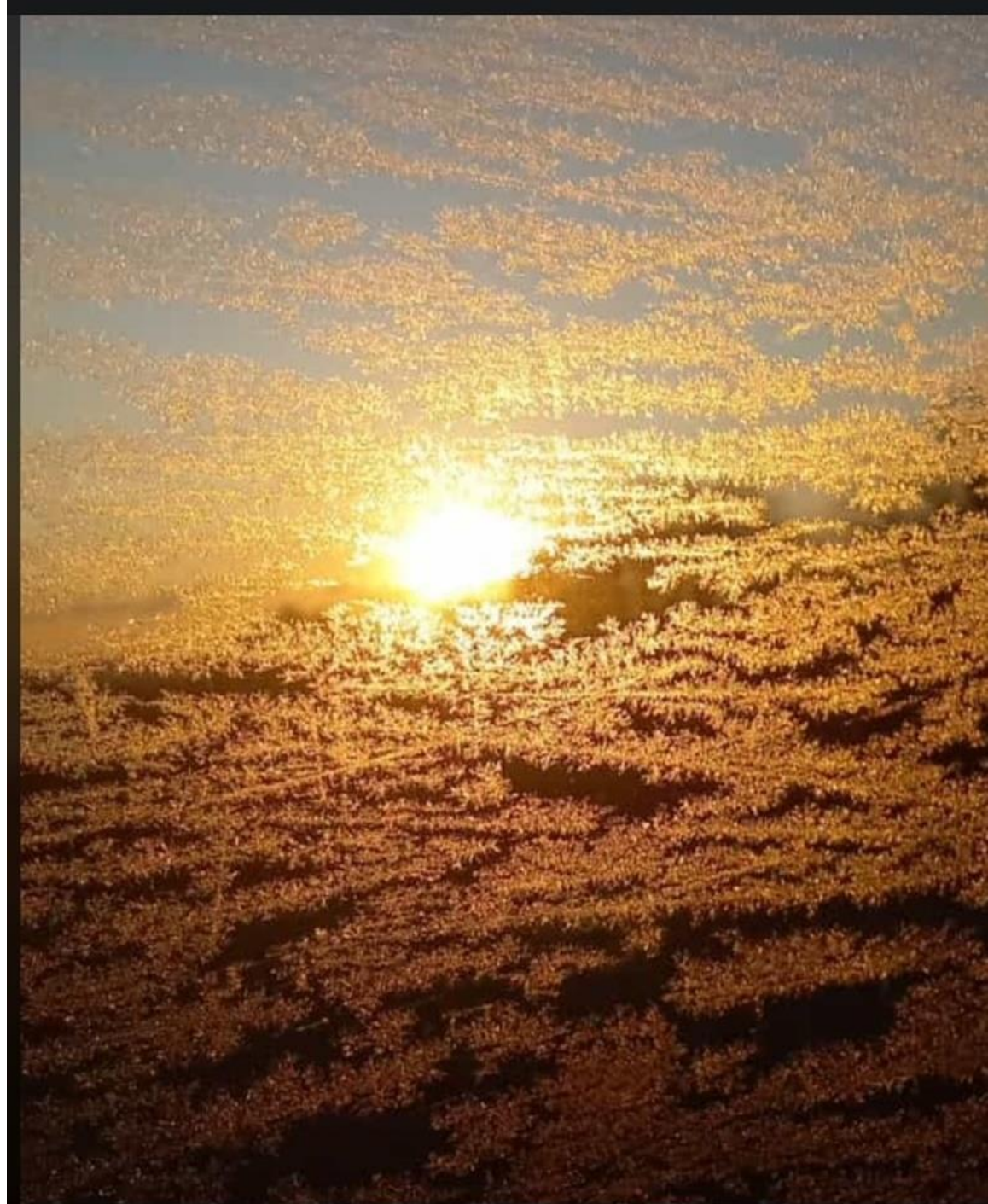

Well done to Eleanor in Year 7 who won the competition with this thoughtful and stunning photo.

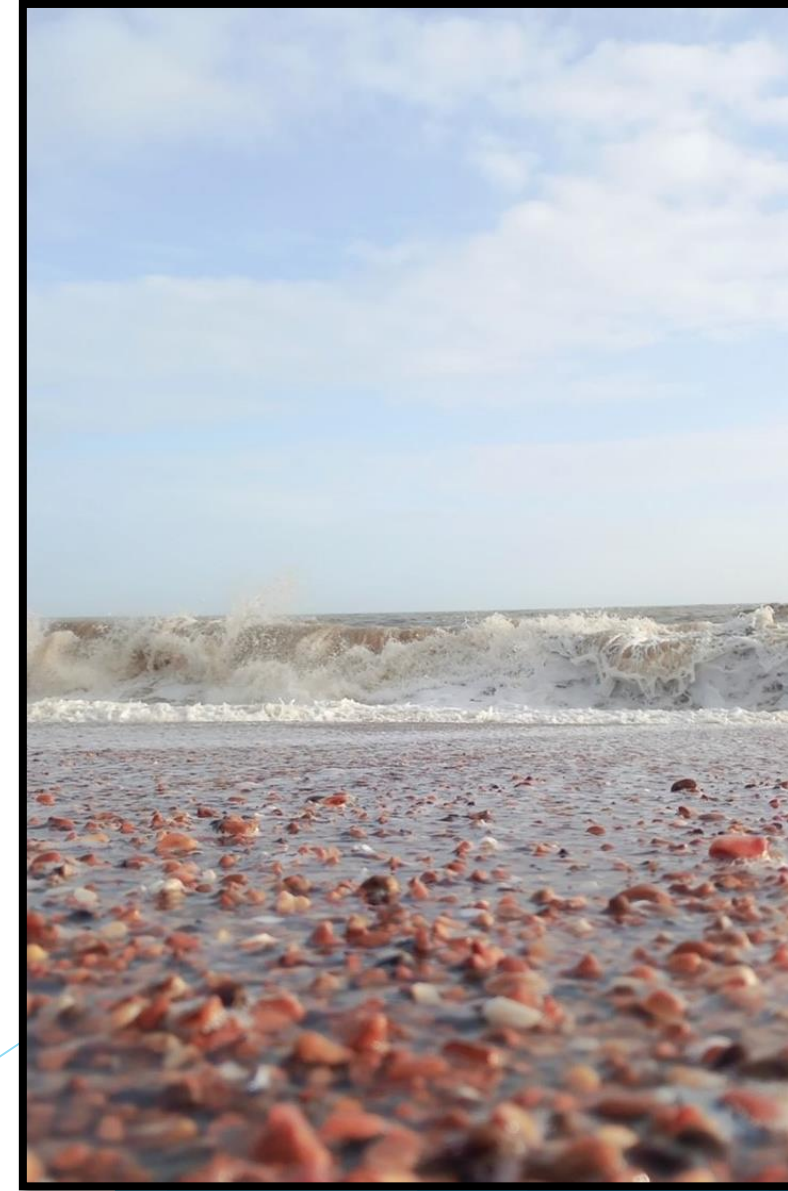
Pro Photographer Tom Oldham said:

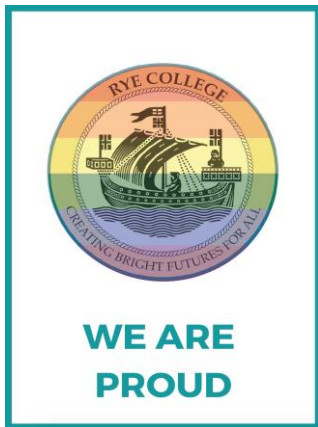
Corridor behaviour
