

# Festival of the Week: Gurpurab 8<sup>th</sup> November

- Guru Nanak's Birthday a Sikhi festival to celebrate the birth of the religion's foundation
- Guru Nanak was born on April 15, 1469, in modern-day Pakistan. A Gurudwara was built at his birthplace in the city now known as Nankana Sahib.
- It is the most important festival for the followers of the religion of Sikhism.
- Gurpurbs in India are celebrated on the actual anniversary of the event they celebrate. In contrast, in the UK, Sikhs often celebrate them on the Sunday nearest to the date.
- ▶ Kada Prasad is prepared on this day to celebrate the holy festival of Gurpurab. Kada Prasad is a traditional sweet made using wheat flour, ghee and sugar. The prasad is prepared in large quantities to make sure it can be distributed to as many people as possible.
