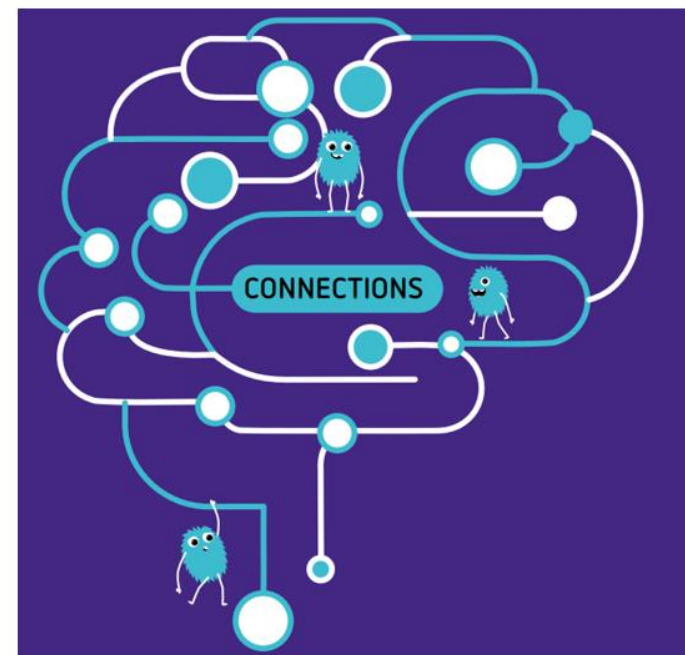
This years British Science Week had the theme of 'Connections'

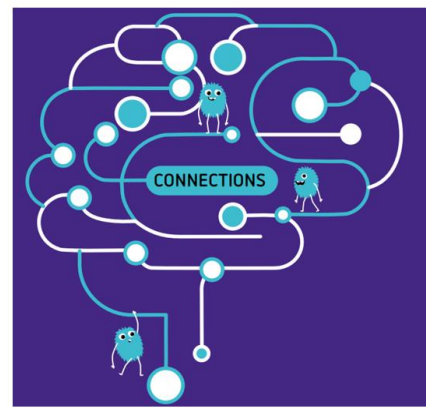
