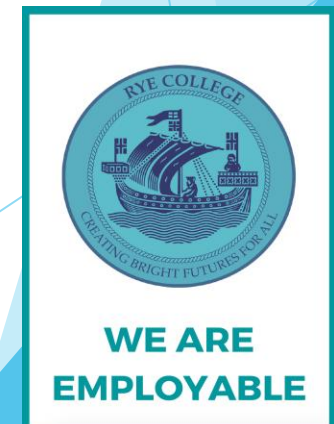
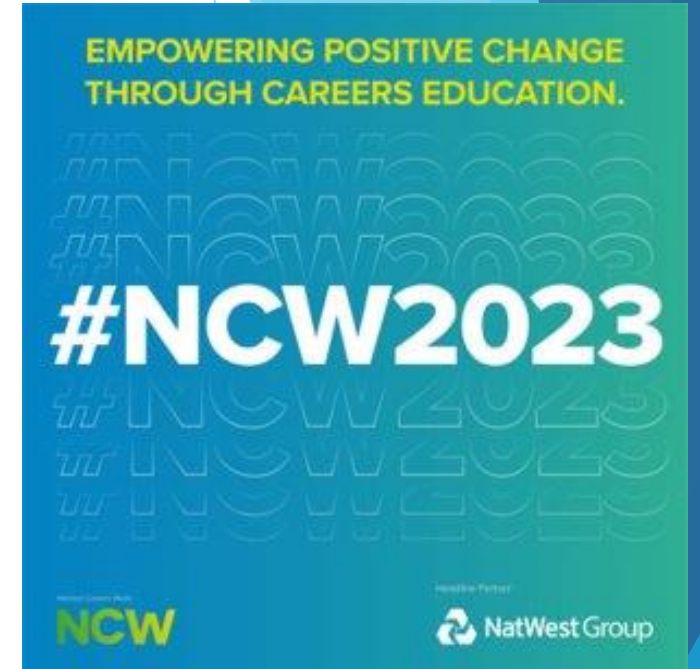
# We are a GOOD school

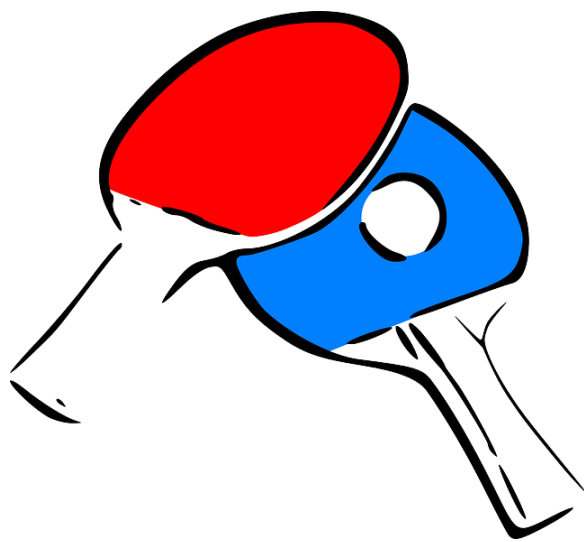

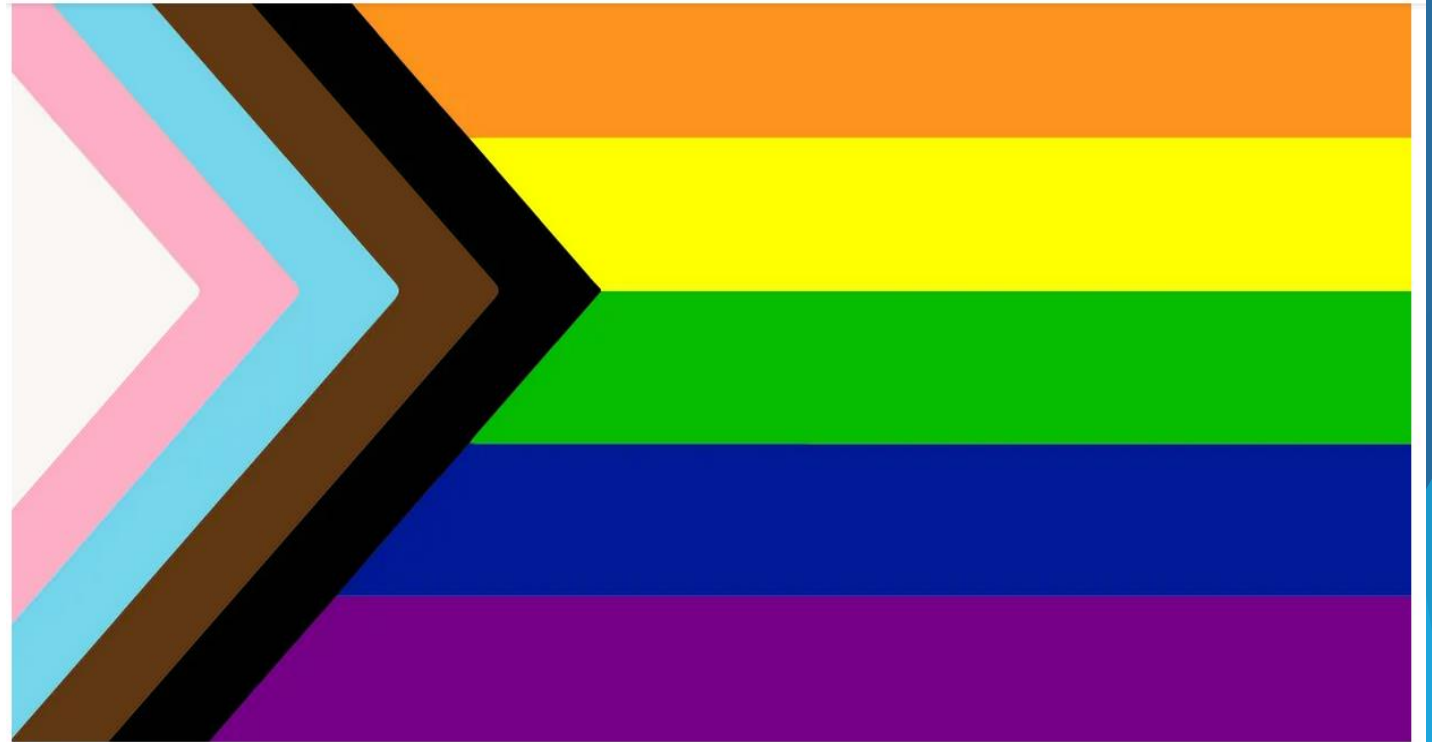

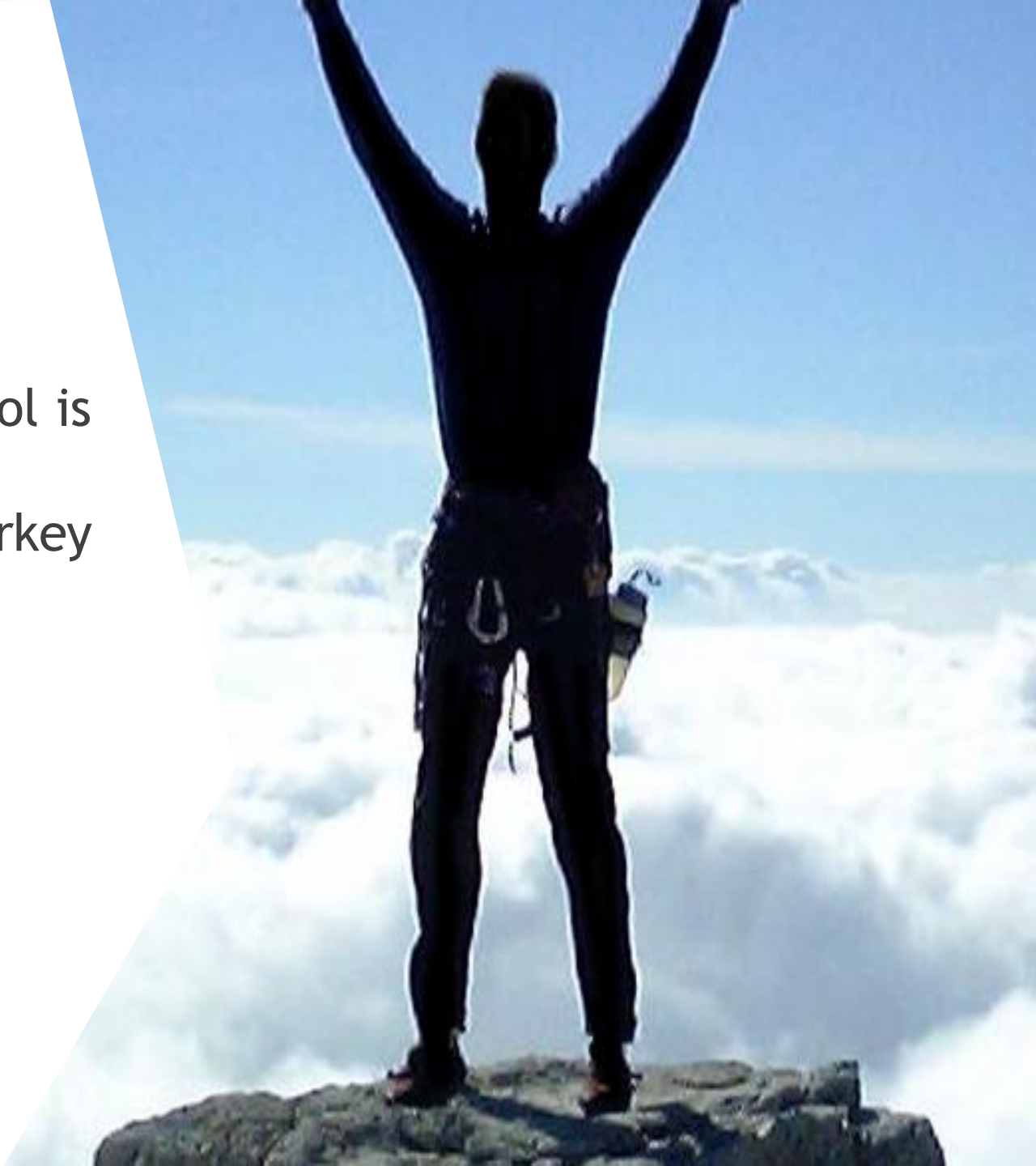
