



Festival of the week **MARTYRDOM OF GURU ARJAN**

Wednesday 16th June

- ▶ This festival is one of the major Sikhi gurburbs (festivals relating to the Gurus), and as with other gurburbs, the day is preceded by an akhand path, a continuous reading of the Sikh scriptures.
- ▶ It is observed for several reasons.
- ▶ It marks the day when the fifth Guru was put to death after severe tortures on the orders of the Moghul Emperor, Jehangir.
- ▶ Traditionally, a cooling drink known as a Chabeel is distributed on this day, recalling that the Guru was tortured in the extreme heat of June.
- ▶ Despite having a sword - the Kirpin - as part of the 5Ks worn by adult Sikhi men, Sikhism teaches that violence is the last resort to prevent/avenge evil.
- ▶ Guru Arjan became the first Sikh martyr, having given his life upholding justice. The Guru lived out the divine message (*Gurbani*) of conquering death and suffering. He remained fearless in defending the truth, and showed how one can remain steadfast.




NO DETENTIONS
