Thursday 26th May

This commemorates Jesus Christ's ascension into heaven (as per Christian belief), which occurs on the Thursday, which is 40 (or 39) days after Easter.

The ascension is important to Christians because: It shows that Jesus really had overcome death - he wasn't just resurrected to die again, but to live forever.

Ascension Day celebrations include processions symbolizing Christ's entry into heaven and, in some countries, chasing a "devil" through the streets and dunking it in a pond or burning it in effigy - symbolic of the Messiah's triumph over the devil when he opened the kingdom of heaven to all believers.

- ▶ The day is designed to encourage people to feel curious about numbers, explore how they benefit in their day-to-day life and give them the confidence to develop and improve their numeracy skills.


The Digital Age
