

History Year 9 – The final Key Stage Three year focuses on modern history, and can utilise primary evidence through actual film footage and photographic evidence of events in particular to investigate the past. Students explore the complicated political dimensions of the past, and address ethical as well as historical questions to explore events and the effects that their long term impacts are still having on the present.
