We held our first Clownfish class sharing assembly, where the children read facts about the solar system and sand a song about the planets. They did such an amazing job and were very confident. We were very proud!

We have been busy learning songs and getting ready for 'The Big Little Nativity!' We have really enjoyed getting ready for the show and have loved learning the catchy songs.

In math's we have completed our unit on addition and subtraction and 2-D and 3-D shapes. We have been counting up in 2's and exploring the 100's square and finding patterns. We are looking forward to Spring Term 1 in January.

### **SEA TURTLES**



Sea Turtles have thoroughly enjoyed their, 'Intrepid Explorers' topic. The children especially enjoyed their planetarium experience with the astronomers from the Observatory Science Centre, Herstmonceux. In English this term, we have been reading 'The Way Back Home', by Oliver Jeffers. Sea Turtles have written their own stories based on this book.

In Science, we have been learning about the uses of everyday materials. Sea Turtles have identified and compared the suitability of a range of everyday materials. They also learnt how the shapes of objects made from some materials can be changed.

In Design Technology we have designed and made our own alien puppets.

In History, we have been learning about Neil Armstrong and the first moon landing.











## **BARRACUDAS**



This term in Barracudas we have been learning the story of 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes and written our own monster stories and poems based on it. In science we've learnt about magnets and forces and made our own magnetic games. In DT we have found out about 'pneumatics' and made our own monsters with a pneumatic device to open the mouth. This was really tricky so thank goodness we had lots of parent helpers. What a busy term we've had!







#### **ORCAS**



Orcas have been looking at 'The Iron man' By Ted Hughes. We have studied written styles and structures within the book. We then used similar techniques to write our own short story. Next, we looked at the poem 'The coming of the Iron Man' By Brenda Wiliams. We studied the poetic devices used throughout the poem and created our very own poems. Our last task in English was to write a book review. We looked at the key features of a book review and then wrote our own about 'The Iron Man' By Ted Hughes.

In maths we finished our learning of addition and subtraction, with multiple exchanges, using the column method. We then went on to develop our multiplication and division skills, focusing on 6, 9, 7, 11 and 12-times tables.

In science we have been learning about forces. We have experimented with push and pull forces, looking at different surfaces that cause friction. We went on to learn about magnets; experimenting with different materials (to find out which materials are magnetic) and how magnets repel and attract











#### **SHARKS**



What a term it has been! We have learnt so much about space in our Science work, English Writing and Book Talk.

We have had so much fun learning 'Rocking around the Christmas Tree' in Music using the ukulele and spent time pronouncing and writing French words and phrases for different animals and our family.

In Computing, we have been designing our own webpages and learning about Internet safety. Some of the pupil's designs were really creative and they really tried hard.

Maths this term has mainly focused on fractions. Most pupils have made real progress here and hopefully feel happier tacking these in upcoming mocks.

Thank you to everyone that managed to come to our parents' afternoon too. We had a great time creating some amazing art work in the style of Peter Thorp.
