We have seen an increase in children being dropped off late in the morning and also picked up late at the end of the day.

Doors open at 08:40am and school begins at 08:45am.

It is very important that your child attends school every day and on time. Arriving late to school is unsettling for children and also very disruptive to the rest of your child's class.

Getting to school on time really matters. It sets them up for the rest of their day. It allows them to settle into class and complete activities such as the register and picking their dinner choice.

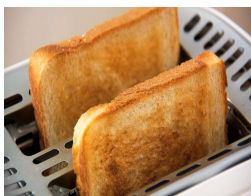
Tips to help get to school on time everyday

- Make sure your child understands why school is important
- Show interest in what your child has been doing at school
- Establish a good evening and morning routine
- If mornings are hectic in your household, get as much as you can ready for school the night before
- Catch an earlier bus or set off a little earlier if you walk
- Check alarms are set correctly
- Arrange appointments for before or after school or during the school holidays

Please can we ask that children are picked up on time at 3.15pm.

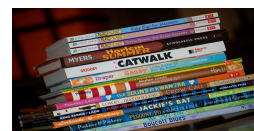
Late collections can cause children to become anxious or worried. Teaching staff often have meetings after school that they also must attend. If after school club is needed, this is run by CoolKidz and contact details can be provided by school.

If children are not picked up on time a charge may be incurred.



Polite reminder – If you pay for your child to have toast every week, this needs to be paid on ParentPay by Monday morning at 09:30am. After this time, they will go on next week's list. The cost of toast is £1 per week.
