This Sundays Readings

3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 35:1-6,10

God himself is coming to save you

Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy.

The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God.

Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. Look, your God is coming,

vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.'

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy for those the Lord has ransomed shall return.

They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.

Response: Come, Lord, and save us.

Second Reading: James 5:7-10

Do not lose heart; the Lord's coming will be soon

Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming. Think of a farmer: how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn rains and the spring rains! You too have to be patient; do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! The spirit of the Lord has been given to me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading

Matthew 11:2-11

'A greater than John the Baptist has never been seen'

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.'

As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says:

'Look, I am going to send my messenger before you;

he will prepare your way before you.

'I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'

REFLECTION

It makes our hearts beat a little faster, it raises our spirits, it makes the day and all its doubts and uncertainties disappear, it fills us with the feeling that nothing else can, it's name is Joy and Advent is full of this great gift. If we look carefully, we can see it breaking out all around us. Christianity is not for those who have no faith in the future, it is about the joy in what is to come, and it is enkindled in our hearts each Advent season.

It was joy that inspired Isaiah to write the words we hear in our first reading. There is no cause for concern in his words. They are full of expectation. He sees all creation crying out with joy for what is to come. The deserts will bloom with the promise of that day, and all will see the glory, the splendour of God. Our wilting spirits will be raised through the promise of the season. Those who suffer will find healing, the blind, the dumb, the lame, the deaf, all will see the mercy of God.

James tries to throw caution on our joy, he is living through the time after the resurrection; he trusts in the prophesy of Isaiah, but he also recognises that all is not well in his world. He calls on the people to be patient. He has seen the seed of Christ sown in the world, but he knows it will need autumn and spring rain to bring forth its harvest. He urges us to live in peace with our neighbours, to wait patiently on the Lord.

John, too, is impatient, cast down into his aloomy dungeon he finds it difficult to see any joy in his situation. He hears the stories of a man, Jesus of Nazareth, who is walking the dusty roads of the land, bringing consolation and healing to the people. These stories gladden his heart, he needs to know more, can this be the promised one of God? Then word filters back, Jesus sends to tell John that Isaiah's prophesy is being fulfilled, the blind see, the lame walk, the dead are raised to life and the Good News is being proclaimed to the poor. In the midst of despair. John finds hope, his spirit is raised. and joy fills his heart giving him, the greatest of men, the strength to endure whatever is David Frank to come.




Advent is Half Over!

Answer to front page: St. John was in prison.


