This Sundays Readings 24TH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

First Reading: Exodus 32:7-11,13-14

The Lord spoke to Moses, 'Go down now, because your people whom you brought out of Egypt have apostatised. They have been quick to leave the way I marked out for them; they have made themselves a calf of molten metal and have worshipped it and offered it sacrifice. "Here is your God, Israel," they have cried "who brought you up from the land of Egypt!" the Lord said to Moses, 'I can see how headstrong these people are! Leave me, now, my wrath shall blaze out against them and devour them; of you, however, I will make a great nation.'

But Moses pleaded with the Lord his God. 'Lord,' he said 'why should your wrath blaze out against this people of yours whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with arm outstretched and mighty hand? Remember Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, your servants to whom by your own self you swore and made this promise: "I will make your offspring as many as the stars of heaven, and all this land which I promised I will give to your descendants, and it shall be their heritage for ever."

So the Lord relented and did not bring on his people the disaster he had threatened.

Response: I will leave this place and go to my father.

Second Reading:

1 Timothy 1:12-17

I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who has given me strength, and who judged me faithful enough to call me into his service even though I used to be a blasphemer and did all I could to injure and discredit the faith. Mercy, however, was shown me, because until I became a believer I had been acting in ignorance; and the grace of our Lord filled me with faith and with the love that is in Christ Jesus. Here is a saying that you can rely on and nobody should doubt: that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners. I myself am the greatest of them; and if mercy has been shown to me, it is because Jesus Christ meant to make me the greatest evidence of his inexhaustible patience for all the other people who would later have to trust in him to come to eternal life. To the eternal King, the undying, invisible and only God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our mind, so that we can see what hope his call holds for us. Alleluia!

Gospel Reading

Luke 15:1-10

The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them:

'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say "I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance. 'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say "I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.'

REFLECTION

One of the biggest problems that I have is accepting that I can be forgiven. I guess it is the same with forgiving others, I try to forgive but it is so difficult to forget. We were created without sin, one only needs to look at a new-born baby and one knows that, within that child, there is limitless love. However, we grow, and in that growing we absorb the good and bad that exists in our flawed world and the love that existed can become tarnished with sin. God, however, still looks upon us as that spotless child, born without sin, and His forgiveness is without measure, after all He loved us into being.

Our readings are reflections of God's forgiveness. In Exodus, at the intercession of Moses, he relents from punishing the people who have turned to false gods and instead forgives them. Paul, writing to Timothy, speaks of the mercy he was shown when He became a believer in Christ. Paul recognises that he was a sinner but believes "that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners" and that, through the love and mercy shown to him, he found the grace to become an apostle for Christ.

In today's Gospel there are three parables; in the first a shepherd leaves ninety-nine sheep to look for the one that has gone astray and, upon finding him, rejoices. Then a woman. with ten coins, loses one and turns the house upside down until she has found it and again calls on her neighbours to rejoice. Finally, we have a son who has turned away from home and family, taken his share of his father's estate and wasted his wealth on worldly things. He returns, seeking forgiveness, but fearing rejection, and finds complete forgiveness and rejoicing. For he that was lost is found. These images remind us that God loves each and every human being. Many people search for God but fail to notice that He is searching for them too. Forgiveness is a very difficult thing for us to do. We may try but there is always a niggling doubt in the back of our conscience about how deeply we forgive or are forgiven. With God, forgiveness is complete and inexhaustible, so we must rejoice in our God who is loving and forgiving without limits.
