This Sundays Readings

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4,6-7

Here is my servant, in whom my soul delights

Thus says the Lord:

Here is my servant whom I uphold,

my chosen one in whom my soul delights.

I have endowed him with my spirit

that he may bring true justice to the nations.

He does not cry out or shout aloud,

or make his voice heard in the streets.

He does not break the crushed reed,

nor quench the wavering flame.

Faithfully he brings true justice;

he will neither waver, nor be crushed

until true justice is established on earth,

for the islands are awaiting his law.

I, the Lord, have called you to serve the cause of right;

I have taken you by the hand and formed you;

I have appointed you as covenant of the people and light of the nations,

to open the eyes of the blind,

to free captives from prison,

and those who live in darkness from the dungeon.

Response: The Lord will bless his people with peace.

Second Reading: Acts 10:34-38

God had anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.

'It is true, God sent his word to the people of Israel, and it was to them that the good news of peace was brought by Jesus Christ – but Jesus Christ is Lord of all men. You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.'

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia!

The heavens opened and the Father's voice resounded:

'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.'

Alleluia!

Matthew 3:13-17 **Gospel Reading**

'This is my Son, the Beloved'

Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John. John tried to dissuade him. 'It is I who need baptism from you' he said 'and yet you come to me!' But Jesus replied, 'Leave it like this for the time being; it is fitting that we should, in this way, do all that righteousness demands.' At this, John gave in to him. As soon as Jesus was baptised he came up from the water, and suddenly the heavens opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming down on him. And a voice spoke from heaven, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him.

REFLECTION

On the threshold of a New Year, we begin again the Gospel stories of the Ministry of Our Lord. We look back over two thousand years to the beginning of the Good News, and in our scriptures, we go back even further to the creation stories and the words of the Prophets. When we do this, it is so important not to lose sight of what is to come; we can be so immersed in the past that we fail to understand that we live in the present day and that what we are to be is more important than what we are today.

Isaiah, in our first reading, is looking forward to the coming of the Servant of the Lord. He paints a portrait of a humble man, filled with the Spirit of God, who will act with integrity and justice. This is not the figure of a king or a warrior but of a man who cares for his people. One who will bring true justice into the lives of all the people and who seeks to free those who are blind, those who are in prison, those who live in darkness and bring them back into God's liaht.

Peter has seen God's light, he has followed Him through the Holy Land, sat with him at table, and listened to His word. Now enlightened by that light he realises that the mission of Jesus was not to the Jews alone but to all the peoples of the world. Led by the spirit he comes to the house of Cornelius, a pagan, a Roman, one who in the eves of the Law was unclean. He sits at table with him, shares in his meal and speaks to him and his household about the Lord. He has come to realise that God does not have favourites; after the meal he baptises all who have found faith in Jesus Christ.

John begins the preparations for the coming of Christ; he leads the ordinary people to a baptism of repentance through washing away their sins in the waters of the Jordan. Now Jesus comes to him, He requires no distinction between Himself and the people gathered in this place. He is content to share in this baptism. We are all equal in the eyes of God and, as we enter this new year, the regrets of the past can be put aside if we seek forgiveness and can look forward to working for God's Kingdom and a new life in Christ.
