Trojan War - History



This week, children in Year 6 have been learning about the Trojan Wars in History and the Trojan Horse in particular. They learnt about the discovery in 1873 of Priam's Treasure which suggests that Homer's story may have had some basis in fact. Having examined photographs of



the finding and listened to the story, they freeze-framed parts of the story from the point of view of the Greeks and the Trojans.
