

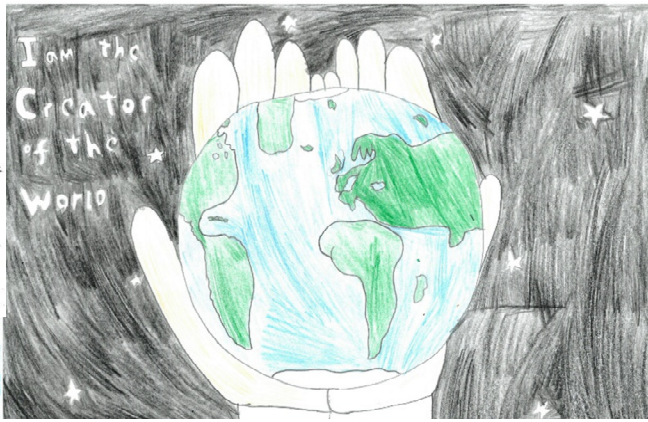

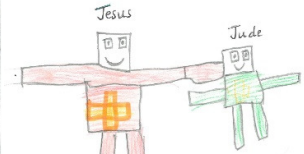

Jesus is my friend.

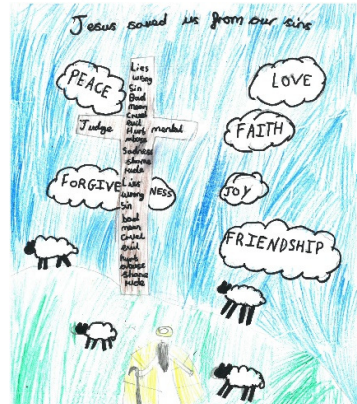

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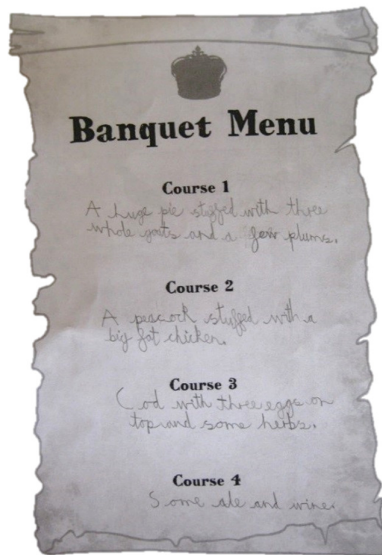
Year 2

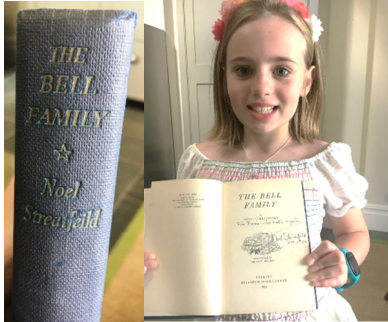


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Year 4

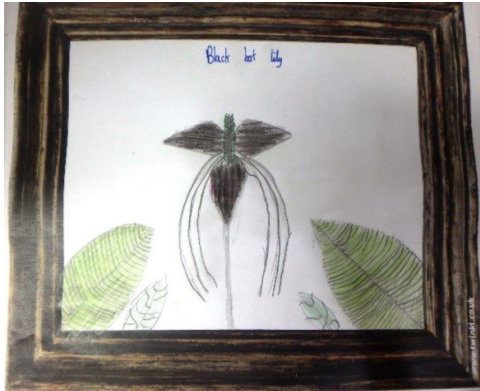
