Foundation Stage & KS1 - Road Safety



Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 enjoyed a morning of "Road Safety" in connection with "Beep Beep Day!"

We learnt how to ride our bikes safely and how important it is to hold a grown-up's hand when we are near traffic and especially in the school car park. We learnt a song to help us remember (to the tune of Frosty Morning):

We also made traffic light biscuits and role-played being a parent and holding hands with our children (teddies!)

We have then been working with mirrors, testing materials for effective curtains, making shadows and reflections and proving that light travels in straight lines.
