RECEPTION

This week Reception have enjoyed looking for signs of Spring around School. We have made chicks and used oil pastels to complete symmetrical flowers. In Maths we have been learning about Money. We have practised recognising coins and adding them together to solve some practical problems.

YEAR 1

Next week is Holy Week so in RE we have been learning about Palm Sunday and Good Friday. We acted out Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. We talked about the meaning of some special words such as 'Hosanna!' and about the other special events we remember in Holy Week. We joined Year 2 for a very thoughtful Stations of the Cross led by Mrs Stanley.



During lockdown we learned about Neil Armstrong in our History topic on Great Explorers and on World Book Day Freddie brought in his amazing Lego construction, a copy of the Saturn rocket that launched Apollo 11. It is made out of 1969 pieces, the same number as the year of the Apollo 11 launch.

YEAR 3

In Year 3 this week we have been working on telling the time and are getting very good at changing times from digital to analogue! In English, we have learnt about the present perfect form and written about Fantastic Mr Fox using this. In Science, we conducted an experiment to test the strength of different magnets. We tested horseshoe, bar, button, wand and ring magnets and found the wand and horseshoe magnets to be the strongest. On Tuesday, we thought about the National Day of Reflection and, using the colour of this day, we made sun catchers in shades of yellow which are now hanging in the classroom catching the light and bringing a feeling of light and hope.



YEAR 4

This week Year 4 have been writing up their non-chronological reports on an urban animal they researched at home. The children produced some creative reports filled with some fascinating facts! As part of our Anglo-Saxon topic, the children each designed a brooch and then made them out of clay. They incorporated the symmetrical designs observed in the original brooches and added some colourful 'jewels' and patterns. We have also continued our Science topic on teeth this week and have been learning about ways to keep our teeth healthy.





Year 5 brought back to school all the wonderful art work that they had completed during Home Learning. We could then share and display all the fabulous pieces which included: graffiti and one-point perspective designs of their names, the longest line, implied textures, chocolate box zentangles and learning different shading techniques.

On Friday 19th March, Sacred Heart School celebrated World Book Day. The children came dressed as characters from 'Alice In Wonderland' by Lewis Carroll and they all looked absolutely amazing! In Year 5, the children designed their own Mad Hatter hats using a variety of different materials:



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2021 CENSUS

Monday was School Census day for Sacred Heart School. Together we compiled a set of questions answered by all classes and then variously compared and collated using pie charts, bar charts, tallies and pictograms, generating some interesting questions along the way. Given that this Census snapshot is taken during a time of pandemic, we wondered what difference that has made to the nation's answers - about place of work, occupation.... I don't suppose any of us declared overnight visitors! The children enjoyed the practical application of maths skills to answer real life questions. All in all, an interesting exercise in social history through a mathematical lens.



YEAR 6

This week in Y6 the children have been learning about the census. They collated the information from the school's census and made pie charts to represent the data - they practised so many mathematical skills including using compasses to draw circles, using a protractor to construct pie charts and interpreting data. They also made mini books which tell of the history of the national census and explains why they are important.
