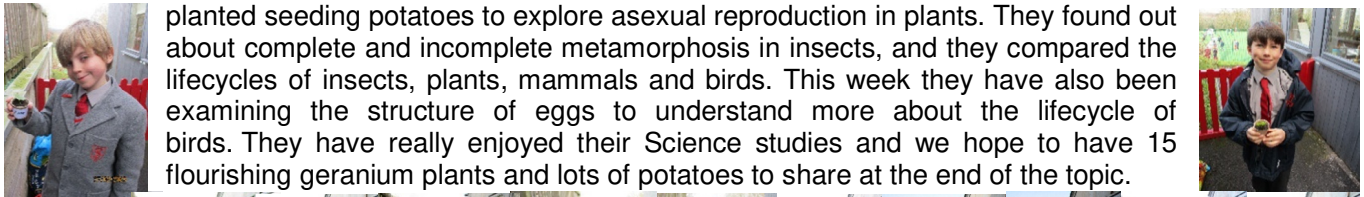
YEAR 1

We have been working with big numbers this week, counting on and back on the hundred square and finding hidden numbers. We represented different numbers using a variety of concrete materials, reasoning about the number of tens and ones in each number. We have also enjoyed warming up our brains with early morning Maths games. We love using the calculation chute, making butterfly and spider 20 bonds, counting on and back in fives to 100 and making groups of 'ten and some more' using little men which we also sorted. We love Maths!



YEAR 5

Year 5 have been learning all about Lifecycles in Science. They have investigated sexual reproduction in plants and they dissected a flower to identify the male and female gametes. They also took cuttings of geraniums and planted seeding potatoes to explore asexual reproduction in plants. They found out about complete and incomplete metamorphosis in insects, and they compared the lifecycles of insects, plants, mammals and birds. This week they have also been examining the structure of eggs to understand more about the lifecycle of birds. They have really enjoyed their Science studies and we hope to have 15 flourishing geranium plants and lots of potatoes to share at the end of the topic.



They have also been working on their own scripts for a scene from the Shakespeare play "Macbeth". In small groups, they chose a scene, and then worked together to write their own script including stage directions props and sound effects. Some groups even tried to include some of the Shakespearian language they have seen and listened to in extracts from the plays. They rehearsed and then performed some excellent scenes to the rest of the class. It has been a fantastic learning experience, starting with the Globe Theatre visit and culminating with their own performances,

where they were able to show just how much they had learnt. Hopefully this is just the start of their life-long love of Shakespeare.
