NURSERY

Nursery parents/carers enjoyed a chance to visit the Nursery for coffee and cake after our Mother's Day Assembly.



YEAR 1

We had a very special visit from Dr Ramjohn, Jemima's Mummy, to learn more about our bodies and how to take care of them, as part of their RSE curriculum.

We made the most of the lovely weather in our Science lessons and went outside for a bird watch and a hunt for signs of spring.

In RE we acted out the story of Palm Sunday.



YEAR 3

In their Science lessons this term, the children in Year 3 have been learning about forces and magnets. They used iron fillings to investigate the pattern a magnetic field makes. They were then challenged to sort a very random collection of items into those that were magnetic and those that were not. Amongst the items to be sorted were some coins. The children found that some coins were magnetic and some were not, even coins of the same denomination! This led onto some research into why this was and learning that the metals coins are made from has changed over the years, meaning that more coins are now magnetic! The children have also learnt about the poles of a magnet and used this knowledge to make their own compasses.



YEAR 5

Year 5 have been very busy in the last few weeks. In Science, they have been learning all about sexual and asexual reproduction in plants. They have taken cuttings from trailing geraniums and planted seeding potatoes, to investigate asexual reproduction, where there is only one parent plant. Over the next few weeks, they will monitor growth and hopefully, there will be a bumper potato crop with lots of lovely flowers by the end of term! Earlier in the term, they also dissected flowers to identify all the different parts of the flower that are involved in sexual reproduction, where two parent plants are involved in reproduction.



In English lessons, children have read 'Romeo & Juliet' and 'MacBeth', and then they acted out scenes from the plays. This week they have been collaborating on writing a play script for a particular scene from one of the plays, which they will then act out for the rest of the class. They have really enjoyed learning about Shakespeare and there are definitely some budding actors in Year 5!
