Staying with the Harry Potter theme, they have written instructions in English: some chose to write how to survive the Forbidden Forest, others how to make potions, survive certain lessons or even how to reach Hogwarts in the first place! They also went through a Sorting Ceremony having used modal verbs to explain why they ought to be sorted into their favourite Hogwarts' house.

YEAR 5 – STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Some children were readers; they explained each of the Stations, described what happened, and then invited the congregation to reflect with a special prayer. Other children acted out the parts, showing how Jesus made his journey with the cross, was crucified and then placed in the tomb. Taking part in the re-enactment has really helped the children to understand and appreciate the sacrifice Jesus made for us all.
