For many 'coming Home' never loses its excitement: The prospect of welcome, warmth and the renewal of love can energise one's whole being and Christmas is when most manage to come. Some cannot come all the way themselves and somebody from Home goes to meet them. That might entail going to the airport. But such a journey is never a burden but always a joy.

While most people belong to some family or neighbourly Home, there are still many who are <u>homeless</u> this Christmas. Some of them have a place to live but the loneliness destroys the Homeliness; others, like the Lord Jesus have not a place to lay their heads and experience the rejection of there being no room in the Inn for them. To create a Society where every person is at Home is a basic Christian Duty at Christmas and always.

To be at Home is to be where one belongs, where the vulnerable one feels more secure, where failure is forgiven, where trust evokes new beginnings, where the joy of being related is celebrated and the bonds of togetherness helps one face adversity. Christmas is a time of being at Home in this way, with each other and with God. At Bethlehem God made His Home with us and amongst us and He still does. He is always at Home for us and Christmas is the time when <u>most</u> come <u>Home</u> to Him.
