


NEWSLETTER NO.1 AUTUMN TERM – 06 SEP 2019 Welcome Back!

REMINDERS

Parking

To avoid traffic congestion on the drive and in the playground during peak times please abide by the following guidelines:

- The area outside the gates adjacent to the priest's garden is reserved for parents who wish to 'drop off and go'. Do not park here between 09.45 and 10.45am to leave parking places free for those attending parish mass. One space must be reserved at all times for Fr Martin.
- When you come into the playground always reverse into your parking space
- When parking, start from the Foundation Stage building end of the playground to facilitate circulation around the entrance/exit.
- When entering the site please give priority to those leaving the playground
- Please do not park in front of the church as this area is reserved for staff.
- Do not leave siblings unattended in the car whilst you drop or collect your child/children.
- Do not park on the narrow section at the bottom of the drive at any time.

Please inform anybody who might be collecting your child of these guidelines.

At the end of the school day we do not discharge pupils from school until we can entrust them into your care therefore, if collecting from the yellow rope, please <u>approach it</u> when you see that your child is waiting. Please ensure that children do not run off or behind the parked cars. In order to alleviate congestion parents are requested to leave promptly once they have collected their children.

When you bring your children to school in the mornings please accompany them to their school entrance. Do not ask them to cross the playground unaccompanied as there may be circulating traffic.

Please do not park on the road immediately outside the school as this makes it virtually impossible for cars turning into the school.

Drop off arrangements

- 7.45 8.15am Supervision in Nursery, additional fee
- 8.15 8.30am Supervision in Nursery; pupils must not go into other classrooms.
- 8.30 8.45am Pupils may go straight to their classrooms
- 8.45 Registration

Now that the first few days are over we ask for your help in achieving a smooth and punctual start to the morning. Parents are welcome to accompany pupils in Nursery and Reception into class. During this year we encourage Year 1 pupils to become independent about coming into class. From Year 2 upwards please say goodbye at the front door of the school and allow your child to come in independently, hanging up their own coats in the cloakroom and making their own way to class. Please do not go to classrooms before 8.30am as teachers will not be there to supervise or may be involved in a private meeting. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Do not forget that we have 'open classrooms' for KS2 on the first Friday monthly and for KS1 on the first Thursday monthly between 8.30 and 8.45am to give you the opportunity to view your own child's work and the displays. This is not an appropriate time to discuss your child's progress with the teacher, so if you need an appointment please arrange through the office. Teachers are usually able to take a brief message at 8.30am if necessary although a note to the teacher, via your child or the office may be more convenient.

• Clubs

If your child is staying on after school for a club, please send them with a small snack.

Snacks

A reminder that children are encouraged to bring a healthy snack for mid-morning break. Chocolate and sweets are not allowed and crisps should be an infrequent treat. We have a no nut policy in school, so please do not include these in snacks. Please name all lunch, snack and water containers so that they can be re-united when separated from their owners!

Invitations

Please do not send party invitations etc into the classroom to be distributed as it can cause unintentional offence if some children feel they have been left out.

Nail Varnish

Nail varnish may not be worn

Pierced Ears

Pierced ears are discouraged at primary school. If necessary, a small discreet pair of studs may be worn but must be removed or covered for PE lessons. Do not have ears pierced during term time as this means your child may not be able to participate in games.

Jewellery

No jewellery apart from a small wristwatch.

Hair

Long hair must be tied back completely (not half head).
