YEAR 3

During the Easter holidays, the children in Year 3 were asked to design and make a mosaic in connection with their upcoming History topic of The Romans. The children could choose which material they made their mosaics from. Some used paper, others glass squares, pieces of stone, shells, photographs and jewels. They had thought carefully about their designs and came up with a wide variety of subjects. The children had obviously taken a lot of time and care over them and they look fabulous up in the classroom!



YEAR 5



Year 5 have been reflecting on how they can help others in RE and PSHE sessions, and agreed that they would use their cake sale money to try to make a practical difference to improve the life chances of vulnerable people in other countries. They decided to use their money to buy world gifts from CAFOD and there was a class vote to decide how to use these funds in the best possible way. They were able to help an astonishing range of people with quite different needs. This is how they used their cake sale money:

- Funds to teach two people to read, opening doors to education and self-improvement;
- A mosquito net to protect families and particularly babies from deadly diseases;
- Provision of emergency water at disaster sites;
- Fruit tree saplings to feed families and provide produce to sell at market;
- Chirpy chickens - providing eggs and food for families and produce to sell at markets;
- Two personal cleaning kits and a Period Pack to help vulnerable families and young women clean themselves and their clothes and to provide facemasks;
- A goat, which provides milk and free fertiliser!

It has been very rewarding for the children to see how much difference their money has made to the lives of so many people, and it has helped them to understand the difficult challenges so many people have to live through every day.
