
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

OPEN MORNINGS





Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!



YEAR 1



In Maths, we first practised to become wizards at adding and subtracting multiples of tens and also 11, from 2-digit numbers within 100, using many different kinds of manipulatives such as straws, ten frames, cubes and base ten equipment and comparing that to what happens on the 100 square. Then, adding and subtracting 11, we challenged ourselves to make as long a line as possible on the 100-square, choosing



our starting number carefully whilst our friends tried to stop us in our tracks!



YEAR 2

In RE this week, we have been learning about the story of Pentecost. In order to retell the story, we created a dance to show how the disciples were afraid, until the Holy Spirit came to them like tongues of fire to fill them with the joy and courage they needed to go out and spread the Good News.

YEAR 3



In our Art lessons in Year 3 we have been working with fruit and vegetables. We have looked at still life paintings from numerous different artists and periods. We then drew peppers in charcoal, practising the skill of observation; trying hard to draw what we actually saw. This week we have made peppers out of clay, trying to make our sculptures look like the real peppers in front of us and not just our ideas of what a pepper should



YEAR 4

This term, Year 4 have started a new Science topic: Living Things and their Habitats. The children have been learning about both the life processes of living things using the acronym MRS GREN and how to categorise them by looking at their similarities and differences. Last week, the class took a walk around the school grounds to see what living things they could spot and there were many to be found!

In English, we have started our modern fiction topic, reading Mr Stink by David Walliams. Using the characters from the story, the children have been role playing and writing their own scenes. We have been looking at the rules for punctuating speech and the children have included some dialogue in their very creative pieces of writing.



YEAR 5

Year 5 are studying the Vikings this term. Over the Easter holidays, they were busy making their own Viking longships which they could make using any materials that they liked. The children used wood, papier mache, Lego, card, cloth and string. Their attention to detail on the different parts of their boats was second to none with intimidating figure heads, decorated shields and billowing sails. The children have been learning in class about the different parts of a Viking boat, their functions and evaluating whether the longship was an effective method of transportation. The classroom is now full of an absolutely fantastic fleet of longships ready to launch on a Viking raid!!



YEAR 6

Children in Year 6 have been inspired by the artist, Jasper Johns (b. 1930) to create this collaborative piece which focuses on our school's Mission Statement. Johns was interested in the idea that letters were seen every day, but rarely explored carefully. We hope that our artwork challenges everyone to look carefully for the words LOVE, LEARN, GROW and WORSHIP and to remember that that is what we do every day in our school.



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
