# Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!

## NURSERY

Our story this week has been Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We have listened to the story and then retold it in our play. We have explored porridge oats, had a porridge snack that we shared with our own bears from home, counted and sorted bears by size. We also painted pictures of what we thought Goldilocks would look like.



## YEAR 1

We have started our new RE topic, Special People and, using objects as prompts, we tried to think of the many different helpers there are in church. We then used the props to act out all those special jobs. We were surprised by how many there were!



In Science, we continued our Materials topic and did an investigation to help Paddington bear find the material for his new hat that would keep him dry in the rain. We looked at each of the materials with magnifying glasses, wrote down the big question we were investigating and discussed how to make it fair. Mrs Griffiths thinks we are very clever scientists and Paddington Bear was very grateful. In Art we had fun getting rather messy, using ModRoc to make Picasso style eyes and look forward to painting these this week!



## YEAR 3

At the end of last term, Year 3 finished their Egyptian mummified cats. They had been working on these for a number of weeks, taking a lot of time and care over them and the resulting models are wonderful. They were made using an empty plastic bottle, a polystyrene ball and Mod-Roc - a plaster impregnated bandage. The children started by securing the polystyrene ball onto the plastic bottle. This was then covered in Mod-Roc, or 'mummy bandages', and allowed to dry. The children then painted them using metallic acrylic paints, starting with a base colour and then adding decoration. The results are fantastic as you can see!



## YEAR 5

Year 5 have been working very hard on their coding in ICT this term. They used Kodu to create a special world and then created a game, gaining points by shooting down different objects. In Logo they learned how to create repeated sequences, nested programs and named procedures to create increasingly intricate patterns and complex 2d shapes.

All the children have improved in their coding skills, and some of them enjoyed the programs so much, that they downloaded them at home to continue to improve their skills. They are all looking forward to next term when they will be working on a new and more complex program.
