HAIR AND JEWELLERY

Hair which reaches the shoulder, for both boys and girls, must be tied back completely (not half head). Pierced ears are discouraged at primary school and children are not allowed to wear any type of earrings for PE. 
YEAR 1

As the pictures show, we have had a very busy two weeks in Year One. We have been learning about Ourselves in Science and have had fun labelling the body parts of one of our friends. We found out about our sense of smell, making stinky socks, using herbs and some soap (the latter because they will be decorating the classroom for a while!). In Art, we created a sunflower number line which we will be using during our Power Maths lessons. We have even found some time to play in the quad area and inside the classroom to help us settle into Year One and we made a visit to our old Reception classroom where we enjoyed playing with our familiar toys and had a catch up with Miss Turner.



YEAR 3

In our Art lesson in Year 3 we took a line for a walk! We had to fill the page using one continuous black line that didn't cross itself. The challenge was then to fill the spaces created using oil pastels, staying within the lines and following the maze-like path. This has created really effective pictures with patches of white contrasting with patches of vivid colour. We hope you agree that they look really effective!



YEAR 5

Year 5 have been finding out about the planets in the Solar System. They know that there are 4 rocky planets, Mercury, Venus, Earth and Mars and that there are four gas giants, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune. They discovered that the rocky planets are nearer to the sun than the gas giants, but all of the distances involved are so large, millions of miles, and so quite hard to imagine.

To solve this problem, they used a standard method to scale down all the distances so that they could be represented by numbers of footsteps. One child was the sun, and the others took steps to show where their planet would be in relation to the sun and the other planets. The moon then orbited the earth.

Luckily it was a lovely sunny day. Everyone enjoyed working out the distances and this really helped all the class to visualise the solar system and the position of each planet in relation to the sun.



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
