Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!



All of Key Stage two complete computer programming as part of their ICT curriculum, and each year group investigates different software. This term Year 5 are learning how to program Kodu, which is a visual programming language that enables children to create their own video games. Programming in Kodu is based on dragging, dropping and sequencing various command tiles to produce different activities. You can also use design tools to create your own world in which your game will take place.

Year 5 learnt how to start the program

last week, and how to add and then move characters in their worlds. This week they have been learning how to program characters to collect objects. Later on, they will learn how to move objects randomly and continuously, setting up motion paths. They will complete their games



by introducing a points system, where users can gain points by firing at or eating objects.



All that sounds very complicated, but it is very easy to learn how to use the program and the children have been having great fun. I'm sure parents in Year 5 have already heard lots about it! The children are well on their way to becoming Super Coders!



Reception have all settled in brilliantly to the school routines. We have shared a snack whilst getting to know our Year 6 buddies who have been looking out for us during playtimes. We are looking particularly smart in our new school uniform and have created a painting of

ourselves. Our theme in RE is Family, therefore we have been learning about the importance of our names and





making sure we call each other by name. Last week we created a watercolour painting, where our special names magically formed.
