PROCEDURE FOR SNOW

We have recently reviewed our Emergency Procedures (snow) and wish to advise you of the protocol. If we have snow overnight we will review the situation at school early in the morning and advise you whether we can open or not, via the school website and portal message. We plan to send this information by 7.00 am.

Our aim is to keep the school open if it is safe to do so in order to minimise disruption to parents and pupils. We are aware that conditions often vary depending on locality therefore we do not expect anyone to put themselves at risk.

One of the difficulties we face in the event of heavy snowfall is clearing the drive and playground to enable access. We have a very small staff - of one! - living close to the school and have been really appreciative in the past of the help of parents who can get to school easily and safely and have time to spare and energy for the task.
