Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!



Year 1 were masters at solving the reptile jigsaws in Science. Matching heads, tails, torsos, and legs – if any, we assembled them all!

We loved venturing out into the school grounds during our lesson on Seasons to hunt for signs of spring and found plenty!

Poems about Nature are best started in... nature! We used all our senses to notice and record what we could see, hear, feel and smell, before writing our poems.

In Art we have been painting beautiful spring trees using different techniques.







Year 3 have been learning about the Stone Age, so the children were asked to make a Stone Age weapon. They all came back from the Easter holidays armed to the teeth as they had made spears, axes, knives, clubs, catapults and bows and arrows! The children had really thought about how Stone Age people might have made their weapons and tried to apply the same methods, for example, by sharpening flints or using twine made from natural materials. I'm sure you'll agree they look like quite a frightening tribe!



Year 5 as part of our history topic on the Vikings, have been learning about Viking longships. They have learnt that the ships were skilfully built to sail fjords, rivers and seas with ease in order to explore, pirate and combat. The ships usually measured approximately 25-30 metres in length, could carry up to 60 men and were steered by an oar at the back of the boat. A figure-head at the front of the ship was used to scare the enemy.

During the Easter holidays, the children were asked to make their own versions of a Viking longship using any materials that they felt were most suitable. The results were absolutely fantastic! A variety of media was used for their ships including clay, card, Lego and wood- we even had a ship made out of cake which we all thoroughly enjoyed! The attention to detail and expert craftsmanship ensured that each ship was carefully made to replicate the original! Brilliant work. Year 5!
