

Nursery and Reception took part in a Numicon Scavenger hunt around the Foundation Stage garden. We enjoyed playing mathematical games, one involved performing the number of actions depending on the amount shown on the dice.



Reception also spent time exploring the number 10. We split ten by three groups and displayed these on triangles. We were able to make ten in lots of different ways. We also enjoyed practising our number formations outside.

The Buddy's Key Challenge started off the Year One Number Day. We answered the questions swiftly and had great fun following instructions to find where the pieces were hidden so we finished the puzzle in record time. Next, we did the Triangle Challenge, finding different ways of making ten and twenty by adding 3 numbers. As an extra challenge we tried to overlap the corners of the triangles to make an interesting pattern.

After all that hard work we went outside to count in 2s, 5s and



10s on the outdoor 100-square, chalking the numbers as we went along. After a vote, our favourite class number turned out to be 20 - infinity was ruled out by Mrs Griffiths, even though that would have been interesting too. We then found lots of different ways of making twenty inside a large number 20 shape. We had a lovely Number Day and felt especially happy knowing that our donations would help children less fortunate than ourselves!



Y2 had lots of fun completing a shape puzzle, answering mathematical questions about their favourite number, a 100 square challenge and a collage of their favourite number! An exciting day for everyone!





In Year 3 we had a lot of fun with numbers on Number Day! We spent the day solving number puzzles, taking part in an investigation to find differences around a square and designing posters with numerical clues to our identities.






YEAR 4



The children in Year 4 had lots of fun on Number Day. They completed a number of quizzes involving mental calculations including working in teams to answer the challenging questions for 'Who Wants to be a Mathionaire.' The children also created some lovely 'Figure Me Out' posters where they thought of different number facts about themselves and then wrote calculations for their partners to work out.









As well as coming into school dressed in creative number costumes, Year 5 had a very busy and productive Number Day! The children started off the day working on a Tables Quiz which meant that that could practise their Tables while they had fun! They then moved on to revising some work on decimals - they had to compare the sizes of the decimals, round them to one decimal place and write numbers in between 2 decimals. The children then had the opportunity to win a million points (not pounds unfortunately!) when they played 'Who Wants to Be a Mathionaire?' - this was a game of multiple-choice Maths questions and the more questions they could answer, the more points they could win! The tension was electric! As we are studying Pop Art this term, Year 5 produced some fantastic artwork, designing numbers in the style of a screen print and using complimentary colours from the Colour Wheel. There are nineteen Andy Warhols in the making in Year 5!



Children in Year 6 had a great time on Number Day! They took part in a 'Who Wants to be Mathionaire' competition: working in pairs they had to agree on 12 answers to the quiz questions and then 'lock in' their answers by showing the teacher the agreed letter which corresponded to the answer on the board. Roughly half the class went on to win 1,000,000 points and all of the children managed at least 10/12. After that, they took part in the Mike Askew – 'Square Difference' activity and tried to prove him wrong! They used decimals, negative

numbers and very large numbers to investigate Askew's challenge. They even tried triangles, hexagons and octagons too. After break, Mrs. Overy had incorporated Number into the P.E.



lesson and then in Art they created some abstract pieces in pencil and water colour inspired by the work of Jasper Johns. All in all, they had a thoroughly enjoyable

day and supported a very worthwhile charity. Many thanks to Mrs Griffiths (Y1) and to Mrs Root for organising the day.





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
